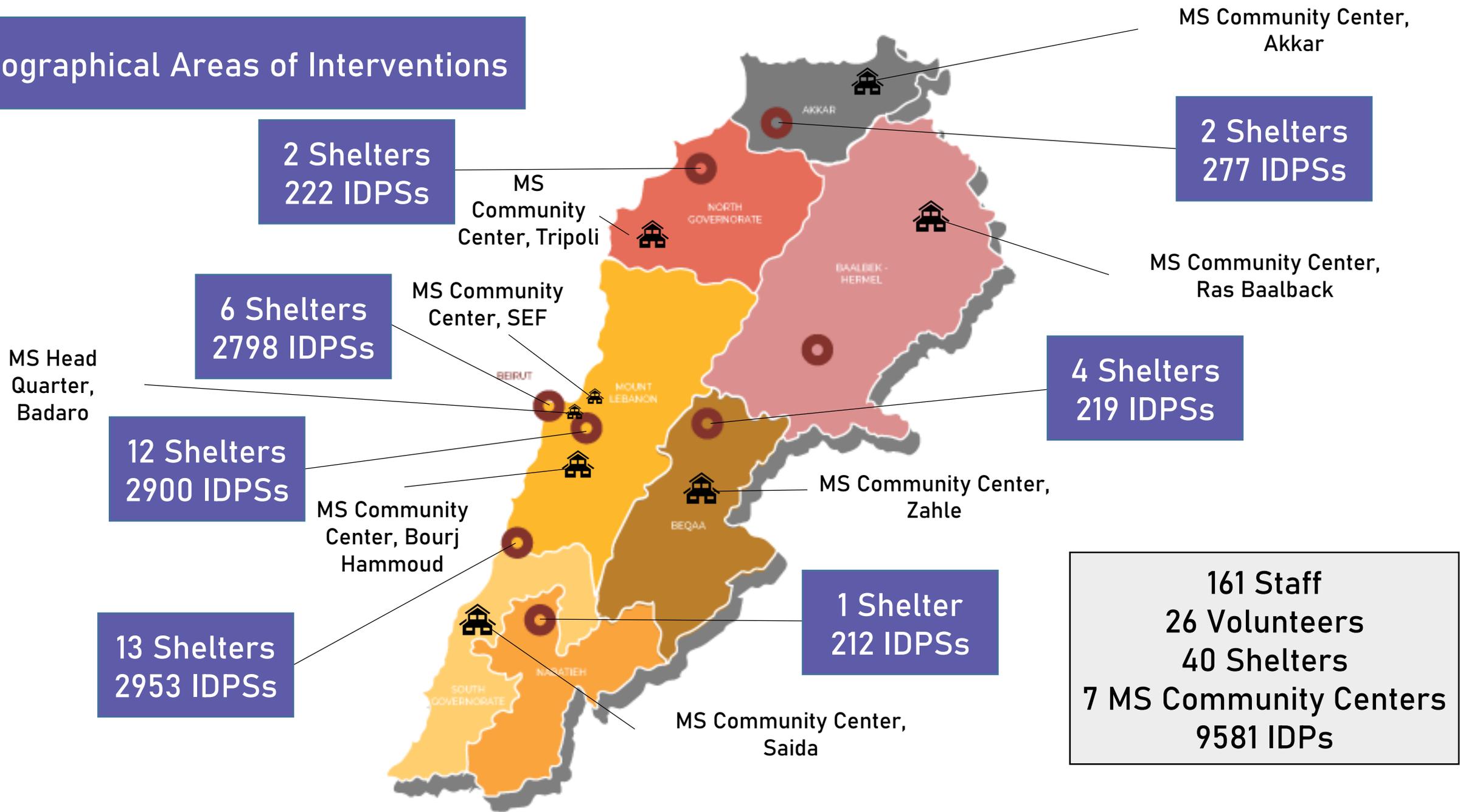




**Mouvement Social In Action

Geographical Areas of Interventions



Intervention Components & Activities

We currently have 2 ongoing projects under emergency, Makani staff are intervening in the shelters, and the Drop-in center in the Mouvement Social Center in Bourj Hammoud.

Under this project, we are implementing under the education sector, 2 main activities:

- Distribution of Educational Kits: Including Lego boxes, ECD Kits, and Recreational Kits to be distributed in the shelters to facilitate the activities.
- Recreational Activities with the children: In a displacement/shelter context, the objectives are:
 - Psychosocial relief
 - Routine and structure
 - Safe expression of emotions
 - Reducing tension in crowded shelters
 - Inclusive participation



Drop-In center Project

The project targets IDPs and vulnerable host communities in Beirut and Mount Lebanon who have been affected by the ongoing escalation of hostilities in Lebanon. Continued airstrikes, insecurity, and damage to civilian infrastructure have displaced thousands of civilians and disrupted access to basic services, including food, hygiene facilities, protection services, and psychosocial support. Women, children, and persons with disabilities are disproportionately affected by displacement and economic hardship. Many displaced families are currently living on the streets or in overcrowded conditions with limited access to sanitation facilities and food, while children face heightened protection risks, including child labor, school dropout, and psychosocial distress resulting from exposure to violence and instability.

The Bourj Hammoud Drop-In Center serve as critical community hubs where vulnerable individuals can access essential services in a safe and dignified environment, through which displaced families are able to access hygiene facilities, receive hot meals, participate in awareness and psychosocial support sessions, and obtain case management services and referrals to specialized services provided by other actors when protection concerns are identified.

Building on previous emergency response experience, the project aims to address urgent humanitarian needs by providing integrated protection, hygiene, and basic assistance services while strengthening community awareness and support mechanisms for vulnerable families.

Coordination and Collaboration with other NGOs



Mouvement Social continued to expand collaboration with national institutions and specialized partners to promote psychosocial well-being and community engagement. In partnership with the Ministry of Culture, psychosocial and recreational activities will be organized within public library spaces, providing children with structured and supportive environments that encourage learning, creativity, and emotional expression.

FLER Activities will be implemented across several governorates in Lebanon (inside shelters, in Mouvement Social Shelters, and in public library spaces) where 123 Mouvement Social staff members were trained to deliver a holistic standardized approach.

FLER is one of the Protection and Education in Emergencies interventions. It aims to launch organized protection and educational activities for children affected by crises as quickly as possible, usually within the first six weeks of the crisis. This intervention will be implemented for a maximum period of six months, following a phased approach that aligns with the child's recovery pathway.

The program is built on five core recovery principles: Safety, emotional regulation, social connectedness, self-efficacy, hope.

These principles are achieved through a set of key program components:

- **Community-Based Psychosocial Support (CBPSS):** Psychosocial support sessions will be implemented during the initial phase to address children's immediate psychosocial needs and to strengthen their sense of safety and stability.
- **FLER Recreational Pack:** A set of structured play and creative activities to be implemented gradually to support psychological stabilization and foster cooperation and resilience among children.
- **Life-Saving Messages:** Age-appropriate awareness sessions delivering key safety, protection, and preventive behavior messages during emergencies.
- **Child Learning Pathway Program – Emergency Track:** To be delivered after the initial stabilization phase, this component focuses on strengthening social and emotional skills and building children's self-confidence and sense of hope.
- **Basic Literacy and Numeracy (BLN) for Out-of-School Children and Retention Support:** Provides basic literacy and numeracy support for children outside the education system, as well as intensive academic support for children already enrolled in school to help them remain in the education system.
- **Caregiver and Community Engagement:** Awareness sessions for parents and community members to reinforce protective messages, promote safe parenting practices, and strengthen the support network around children.

Activities that will be implemented next week

Following the completion of all logistical preparations and the procurement of required materials, Mouvement Social is ready to initiate the implementation of several emergency interventions.

With all logistical arrangements finalized, the following projects are scheduled to kick off starting next week in response to the urgent needs of displaced populations.



Activities that will be implemented next week

Pathways to PEACE project, funded by UN Women:

To address urgent food insecurity among displaced populations while promoting women's economic participation, the project will set up a community kitchen in Hlaliyye in an already-equipped kitchen. Operating for an initial three-month emergency period, the kitchen will function as a centralized food preparation site and will prepare daily hot meals for displaced individuals and families, prioritizing those currently sleeping on the streets. In addition to that, MHM kits will be distributed in shelters

PEACE Project, in partnership with Christian Aid, funded by the Disasters Emergency Committee:

Women, children, and persons with disabilities are disproportionately affected by displacement and economic hardship. Many displaced families are currently living on the streets or in overcrowded conditions with limited access to food; the project will set up a community kitchen in the Bourj Hammoud Mouvement Social Center in an already-equipped kitchen. The kitchen will function as a centralized food preparation site and will prepare daily hot meals for displaced individuals and families.

In collaboration with Embrace, a mobile mental health clinic will be established in front of four MS community centers to host children with mental health issues for consultations and referral to primary health care centers.



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
